How does Jesus prepare me for the tests of life?

Any relationship will always have <u>tests</u>. Jesus passed his test <u>perfectly</u>.

Test #1: Let your <u>appetite</u> control you. Answer: Let God and his Word <u>sustain</u> you.

Test #2: Always want more.

Answer: A relationship with the Lord is <u>enough</u>.

Test #3: Make God <u>serve you</u>.

Answer: Don't try to manipulate God.

The testing never truly stops.

How does Jesus prepare me for temptation?

- He <u>passed</u> my test for me.
- He helps me <u>identify</u> temptation.
- He helps me <u>respond</u> to temptation.
- He reveals the <u>lies</u> of temptation.
