Embolden – To Stand Up for Truth

Getting Started: Is there one specific thing you have done to help with emotional health in the past 2 months? What is it?

Going Back to Sunday

Each week we will start with the question, "What about the message from Sunday had the most meaning or made the biggest impact on you? Another question is "How did this message help me appreciate Jesus at the Hero of my life?" Take time to consider these question as you listen to each message. Bring your sermon notes to class each week to help you remember and share with the group.

Emboldened to Stand Up for the Truth

Read: Acts 2:1-12

In the course of about 2 months Peter and John went from a place of fear (hiding in an upper room) to a place of boldness (preaching in the temple courts).

How did the Holy Spirit use the *truth* to embolden the disciples to see the earthly leaders with proper perspective?

In verse 12 God tells us, "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved." Earlier we asked how this portion of God's Word shows Jesus as the Hero of my life. How does this verse answer that question?

What does this verse teach us about the unique nature of our mission as Christ followers?

Read: Acts 2:14-17

How does thinking of your weakness as room for God's strength change your perspective on the issues you face?

My Next Step:

Identify one area of your life where your weakness is painfully obvious to you. How can you use the truth of God's Word to make this weakness in your life a strength by the power of the Holy Spirit?

Doing Life Together:

Right now there is an immense amount of anger and frustration in Minneapolis over the death of George Floyd while in police custody. How does the truth of God's Word help us to acknowledge, discuss and bring healing to situations like this?

Prayer:

In the prayer section we encourage you to take about 10 minutes to pray as a group. Include the issues of prayer and praise from above. Set aside about 10 minutes so it doesn't feel rushed. Go around in a circle with each person praying, a person may say, "pass" if they are uncomfortable praying out loud.

Friendship:

Spend the final 10 to 15 minutes of group catching up with other group members. Take time to get to know those you don't know quite as well. Make sure to include everyone in the group.
