A whitewashed tomb looks good on the outside and is bad on the inside – What would be an example of a building like that today?

What is hypocrisy? Why do you think it is a huge danger especially inside the church?

Why would a person want to give the impression they were “righteous” when inside they were evil?

Read Isaiah 61:10

In this verse the imagery of a wedding is used. Why, at most weddings, is there an alignment between what is going on in the hearts of those getting married and how they “decorate” themselves on the outside?

How is the “Robe of Righteousness” that Christ gives us more than just outward decoration?

Taking it Home:

Why is it an especially hollow feeling when the way I feel inside doesn’t align with outward decorations of Christmas?
